With the coming of colonizers,  
treaties were made,  
but again, and again the colonizers disregarded and broke the treaties,  
causing grave and lasting harm to the historic caregivers of the land,  
to the generations that followed them,  
and to the land itself.

**All:**

**Called to action for Truth and Reconciliation,  
we who gather here on Treaty One territory  
and the homeland of the Red River Metis  
commit ourselves to finding faithful ways  
of honoring the treaties, the land and one another  
in a spirit of openhearted respect.**

## **WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENT**

### **OPENING STATEMENT**

Today we gather to celebrate Epiphany and the dawning of a new year. As the Magi followed the star to find the Christ child, we too are invited to follow the light of God into the year ahead leaving behind what no longer serves us, embracing hope, and seeking God's guidance. May this year be one in which we live in God's light, share our gifts generously, and walk in faith, joy, and love.

### **CALL TO WORSHIP**

One: Arise, shine, for your light has come!

**All: The glory of the Lord has risen upon us.**

One: Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

**All: We gather to follow the guiding star of Christ, bringing our gifts of love, hope, and faith.**

One: Let us worship the God who calls us to be bearers of light in the world.

**All: Let us rejoice in God's presence, now and always. Amen.**

### **Opening Prayer:**

**God of light and new beginnings, You revealed your glory in a humble child, and drew seekers from afar to your side. As we enter this new year, open our eyes to your presence and guidance.**

**Help us to follow your light in the paths of justice, peace, and love. May this year be one of growth, hope, and courage, where we reflect your glory in our words, actions, and choices. In Christ's holy name we pray. Amen.**

There's a very simple story of a person walking down a dark road at night. They are scared because they don't know what's at the end of the road. They want the daylight so they can see clearly. They're given a little lantern instead. This lantern light doesn't shine the whole way down the road, but it's enough to take the next step. As they walk on, the path becomes clear before them one step at a time. This is how faith works. They're like the Magi who followed the star; they don't have the whole route ahead of them, they only follow the star.

So, as we begin our new year and gather around this table, Epiphany reminds us that God does not always answer all our questions at once. What God provides is light enough for one day. In the sharing of the bread and the cup, we are reminded that we are not alone. Christ meets us here, gives us the strength, and sends us out once again. As you prepare for the sacrament, consider the question of what may be the next step that God is calling you to take and what gift there is that you have to offer as you begin the new year.

After that, he took the cup, poured it and blessed it, and passed it to them saying, "This cup is the sign of the new covenant. Whenever you drink it, remember me."
